

2020 Virginia Agriculture in the Classroom Teacher of the Year



Overview and Application

The purpose of this award is to recognize a Virginia teacher for his/her excellent job in incorporating agriculture into his/her core curriculum. Recognizing that agriculture forms the backbone for our daily lives, Agriculture in the Classroom celebrates those teachers who effectively integrate agriculture into their classrooms.

Eligibility: State licensed PK-12 teachers who are currently integrating agricultural concepts into non-vocational, core subject areas (such as language arts, social studies, science, or mathematics).

Selection Criteria: Teachers must use agricultural information and/or materials in their classroom in order to help students learn the importance of agriculture while also mastering required educational standards. Special consideration will be given to those teachers using Agriculture in the Classroom materials in their classrooms.

Award: The teacher selected will receive a \$500 stipend as well as a scholarship to attend the 2020 National Agriculture in the Classroom Conference to be held in Salt Lake City, Utah, June 23-26, 2020. The scholarship will cover the teacher's full registration as well as lodging and meals. The Virginia winner will also be encouraged to apply for the National Agriculture in the Classroom Teacher of the Year Award.

Application Process: Complete the application form, essay and lesson plan and mail or email to Agriculture in the Classroom.
